Dear Mr. Gough,

I am to inform you of the verdict of the Committee set up to investigate the charges made against you by the Council of the Irish Amateur Fencing Federation, as follows:-

Verdict:-

The Committee exonerated Mr. Gough from any responsibility for the actions of his mentors and from the charges of acting in an offensive manner at any time, but found him culpable in that he refused to accept the ruling of the President of the Irish Amateur Fencing Federation thereby being guilty of a breach of discipline. It was also considered that his failure to disassociate himself from the actions committed on his behalf the performance of which he was aware showed him to be in agreement.

Recommendation of the Committee:-

That the period of suspension be enforced herewith.

At a Meeting of the Council which took place before the above-mentioned Committee Meeting, it was decided that, out of consideration for your Club, you should be allowed to fence on its Team in the Coupe d'Europe (team event) but not in the Heidenheimer Pokal (individual).
