Dear Mr Gough,

Thank you for your letter of 25th January. We do not foresee any particular difficulty in your participating in competitions in Ireland in 1976. I enclose a copy of the Calendar. The notice of the Irish National will be sent to you when available, but the regulations are normally that F.I.E. rules apply except in that members of the Directoire Technique may compete and that the organisers reserve the right of entry, subject to appeal to Council.

Further to your meeting with Mr Wilkes of 30th December, I wish to inform you that the I.A.F.F. considers that, irrespective of the results you may achieve, it would not be in the best interests of Irish fencing that you represent Ireland in the Montreal Olympics. As a corollary the Federation will not be forwarding your results to date to the Olympic Council of Ireland.
